Carson Road Woods

The history of Carson Road Woods begins more than 300 years ago when the first European settlers developed the land that became the Van Cleve and Carson farms. Both farms comprise the majority of the property known today as Carson Road Woods. The Woods was purchased and preserved as passive open space in 2001 and named for the road it borders.

The Friends of Carson Road Woods, Inc. is a nonprofit organization of concerned citizens who preserve and maintain the property. There are over five miles of walking trails throughout the preserve. Some border the farmed fields. Others take you through a rare beech forest and meander along streams and meadows. Pause for a moment and you might catch a glimpse of a fox, rare bird, or a wild turkey - some of the many creatures that call Carson Road Woods their home.

We invite you to visit the Woods, experience its seasonal changes, and enjoy one of the area's natural treasures.


